ABOUT THE MUSIC

Several years ago in a town near you the local band was all set for its annual holiday concert. They had rehearsed all the carols everyone loves and the auditorium was full of friends and family awaiting the performance. Unfortunately, somehow the music in the folders had gotten completely mixed up and when the conductor brought down the baton for the first note complete chaos took over.

As a novelty piece, A Crazy Mixed-up Christmas Concert is full of pranks and musical mischief. Opening with The Twelve Days of Christmas, we go right into a gospel setting of Go Tell It On The Mountain at measure 5. Increase the tempo slightly at measure 14 as we hear a short, staccato version of Up On The Housetop. Temple blocks are important and should not be omitted. Feel free to substitute a wood block if no temple blocks are available. The trombone glissando in measure 19 should be emphasized.

Measure 22 is a very short segment of the Hallelujah Chorus leading into a boisterous moment of Oh Christmas Tree at measure 26

Measure 34 brings us Deck the Halls and Jingle Bells together. Measure 42 is a tender and flowing rendition of Silent Night complete with bird whistle and eight short and sweet measures of It Came Upon The Midnight Clear.

No arrangement would be complete without the western feel of Good King Wenceslas at measure 54. Be sure to emphasize the accents in the low brass parts. With time-a-wasting, we hear both O Come all Ye Faithful and The First Noel at measure 60. Measure 70 brings another short burst of the Hallelujah Chorus leaving us in utter chaos and despair because all the music is on the floor by this time.

All is not lost as we recover and wish everyone a very Merry Christmas!

I hope you and your students enjoy this fun holiday piece. Good luck with its preparation.

Mr. Shaffer is in demand as a conductor for new music reading clinics, music festivals, and music education seminars. During the Summer of 1986 and 1992, he served as instrumental director for the Saskatchewan School of Fine Arts. In February of 1997 he conducted a program of his music, with the China Youth Corps Band in the National Concert Hall, Taipei, Taiwan, Mr. Shaffer is active as an adjudicator for Drum Corps International and Drum Corps Midwest and has judged championship events for both organizations.
